April 13: Our Need Of A Savior

- Romans 3:10-26
 - Why is it important to recognize that all people, regardless of background or behavior, are in need of salvation?
 - Reflecting on your own life, what are some personal ways you have experienced the need for a Savior? How has God's grace and salvation changed you?
 - How can recognizing our own need for a Savior shape the way we relate to others, especially those who don't know Christ?
 - Romans 3:19-20 explains that the law makes us conscious of sin but cannot justify us. How does the law reveal our need for a Savior?

April 20: The Resurrection- The Center Of It All

- Matthew 28
 - Why is the resurrection the central event of the Christian faith? How does the resurrection inform the way we live out our faith daily?
 - In verses 16-20, Jesus commissions His disciples to go and make disciples of all nations. What does the resurrection have to do with this great mission?
 - How has the reality of the resurrection personally impacted your life? In what ways does it shape your identity as a follower of Christ?
 - In Matthew 28:1-7, the angel announces that Jesus has risen from the dead. What is the significance of the empty tomb, both for the women who first encountered it and for Christians today?

April 27: Repentance

Scripture: 1 John 1:9, 2 Corinthians 7:10, 2 Peter 3:9

Discussion Questions:

- 1 John 1:9 promises that if we confess our sins, God is faithful and just to forgive us. How does this verse help us understand the relationship between confession and repentance?
- 2 Corinthians 7:10 contrasts godly grief, which leads to repentance, with worldly grief, which leads to death. What is the difference between these two types of grief?
- Repentance is not just a one-time event but a continual practice in the life of a believer. How do you view repentance as part of your ongoing walk with Christ?
- What are some reasons people might hesitate or resist repentance, even though God is patient and willing to forgive?
- How does repentance not only affect our relationship with God but also our relationships with others?
